PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies that:

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. The United States Department of Education does not consider the following to be an allowable use of ESSER funds, under any part of 18003: 1) subsidizing or offsetting executive salaries and benefits of individuals who are not employees of the SEA or LEAs or 2) expenditures related to state or local teacher or faculty unions or associations.

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

The district leadership team will review the district's Needs Assessment, recent parent surveys, district technology plan and local expenditures due to COV-19 and prioritize expenditures with the CARES Funds. The team's goal is to provide services to students in a timely manner that meet the various student needs caused by the pandemic. Based on the data, the leadership team will determine internet access and the availability students have to technology. The data will determine which method of delivery each student and family may need while offering various delivery options. The local expenditures for schools and the district will be reviewed in order to assure all federal and state guidelines for reopening schools are in compliance. The needs assessment revealed a need for Interventionist (salaries and benefits), additional custodians (salaries and benefits), health aides (salaries and benefits) and equipment for virtual school and activities done remotely.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

At the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year, all students will be given a grade-level screener and/or assessment. The screener will be used to determine if learning gaps are present due to the pandemic. All students will be provided appropriate remediation and instruction.

- (5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;
- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
  - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
    - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and
    - (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
  (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers
- (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

### 6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

- (a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -
- (1) ensuring equal opportunities to participate for all eligible students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries in any project or activity carried out under an applicable program; and

Geneva County Schools will provide all students with equal opportunity and equal access to receive the necessary materials, equipment, and services for students to experience success.

GCS will use School PLP as the learning platform to provide the curriculum. Critical standards, as identified by the Alabama State Department of Education will be the focus. Intervention specialists at each elementary school will be hired to assist our instructional coache in identifying targeted weaknessess in students and providing intervention and remediation plans for students. In conjunction with the grade level teacher of each student in need of intervention or remediation, the intervention specialists will assist classroom teachers with parental engagement activities to assist parents/guardians with there student.
